Is scuba diving recommended at Fihalhohi?

Absolutely! Scuba diving is one of the most popular and rewarding experiences on the island. With vibrant marine life and crystal-clear waters, Fihalhohi is a perfect destination for both beginners and certified divers.

Can I see mantas, sharks, whale sharks, and turtles while diving?

Yes! Many dive sites around Fihalhohi offer the chance to encounter diverse marine life:

- Manta Rays: Frequently seen from May to November (peak season)
- Sharks: Common sightings include white-tip, black-tip, nurse sharks and grey reef sharks. You may also see hammerheads, leopard sharks, or silvertips with some luck.
- Turtles: Hawksbill and green sea turtles are regularly spotted in our dive sites.
- Whale Sharks: These gentle giants are very rare in this region, without a fixed season.

Can I learn to dive on Fihalhohi?

Yes! Fihalhohi is an ideal place to start your diving journey:

- Try PADI Discover Scuba Diving including a theory session, shallow water skills, and a guided lagoon dive up to 12m.
- For Kids 8 to 9 years old, we offer a Bubble Maker program to a max. depth of 2m in safe environment
- Continue your adventure with full certifications such as the PADI Scuba Diver or PADI Open Water Diver course.
- Various PADI Specialty courses for certified divers such as: Night diver, Nitrox diver, DPV and many more...

Do I need a medical certificate to dive?

In most cases, no. Here's what you need to know:

- All divers must complete the international Diver Medical Participant Questionnaire form click here
- If you answer "NO" to all questions, no medical certificate is required.
- If you answer "yes" to questions 3, 5, or 10, or anywhere on page 2, a medical certificate for diving, signed by a doctor will be required.
- If you are 65 years or older, we recommend doing a 'Fit to dive' check-up and bringing the Diver Medical form signed by a physician within one year.
